Lobethal hit the court with confidence, moving the ball smoothly into their shooters, who combined sharp passing with accurate finishing from the very first whistle. Their defensive pressure in Hahndorf's attacking end was equally strong, disrupting Hahndorf's usual rhythm and making every scoring opportunity hard-earned. With their dominance showing early, Lobethal held a 4-goal lead at the first break. The second quarter began much the same, with Hahndorf making changes through the midcourt and goal circle as they worked hard to match the quality play Lobethal continued to deliver. Midway through the term, Lobethal extended their lead to six goals, but Hahndorf refused to back down, dodging, weaving, and pushing the ball with persistence into their shooters. Lobethal remained composed and competitive, moving the ball with ease and making the most of their opportunities. However, Hahndorf's determination paid off, narrowing the gap to just three goals by half-time. Both teams made significant positional changes during the half-time break, but it was Hahndorf who benefited most. Their ball movement suddenly clicked as they began to play with cohesion and confidence.

The midcourt drove the play with pace, feeding their shooters who found space, timed their leads, and converted with accuracy. At the other end, Hahndorf's defence tightened, forcing deflections, intercepts, and rebounds to shift the momentum firmly in their favour. By the final break, Hahndorf had turned the tables and held a 3-goal lead heading into the last quarter. In the final quarter, Hahndorf continued to play as a tight, united outfit. Despite Lobethal reintroducing their star shooters, Hahndorf maintained their pace and composure, pushing the lead out to six goals midway through the term. Lobethal, however, refused to give in, fighting courageously and forcing errors that swung momentum back their way in the closing minutes. With just five minutes to go, the margin had narrowed to three, but Hahndorf held their nerve, controlling possession at crucial moments to secure a hard-fought and well-deserved victory, 35-32.
