BATTLE OF THE BIRDS

injury, taking the court at wing defence. Cluff made an immediate impact, applying intense pressure and forcing several turnovers that helped her team gain momentum. Hahndorf Black edged ahead to take a narrow two-goal lead at the first break. Injury forced early changes for Hahndorf Black, with Caroline Dorr moving to wing defence and Katrina Pollard shifting to goal defence. Hahndorf White also made strategic changes, bringing Teagan Trigg into goal shooter and Georgia Squires into wing attack. However, it was Hahndorf Black who settled better in the second term. The defensive trio of Dorr, Pollard and Ashlyn Shearer worked tirelessly to turn over ball, while the attacking combination of Lauren Sutherland, Kelly Childs, Tori Kaesler and Zoe Edwards capitalised on their efforts. The result was a dominant quarter for Hahndorf Black, who extended their lead to 16 goals at halftime. Hahndorf White responded after the break, with Lily Brown and Macy Llewellyn swapping ends and making an impact at both ends of the court. Strong drives from Annika Sexton in the midcourt and impressive defensive pressure from Zoe Fryer and Eva Beckman helped steady the ship, allowing White to match their opposition goal-for-goal in the third quarter. Further changes in the final term saw Hahndorf Black bring Rochelle Tang into wing defence, while Hahndorf White reintroduced Hayley Luke at wing attack.
